# SEPULVEDA BASIN WILDLIFE AREAS STEERING COMMITTEE MINUTES AUGUST 27. 2024

- 2. The minutes of the May 28, 2024 meeting were approved without objection
- **3. Public comments on non-agenda items**: Richard Davis spoke briefly on an accessible signage project using qr codes, he was introduced to Kathy Schreiner for follow up separate conversation on signage.

### 4.a.Reports from Public Officials:

US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) noted that September 28 2024 will be celebration of National Public Lands Day with Sepulveda Basin activities with CNPS, SFVAS and RAP

We learned that the music festival slated for October 2024 was postponed to 2025.

- **4.b. Reports from Member Organizations:** George Waddell from CNPS noted that they would be participating in the September Public Lands event, also that the monthly restoration events in conjunction with SFVAS and FOLAR have netted over 1700 volunteer hours and 1100 bags of weeds collected. SFVAS continues with its scheduled basin activities and also continues to advocate for enforcement of park rules including zero tolerance for encampments.
- **5. Presentation:** US Army Corps of Engineers on Sepulveda Basin Master Plan Revision. This was a very initial Zoom powerpoint presentation describing what is a Master Plan, the slides are attached to and part of these minutes. The slides explain the purpose of the master plan. The USACE is beginning the revisions of both the Sepulveda Basin and Hansen Dam Master Plans. Important to be aware this is the beginning of the Public Notification period, which will probably

extend through October 2024, the draft Master Plan/EA is anticipated to be released in about a year with a subsequent 30 day public comment period and final release in 2026. There will be a website for the Master Plans for Public/Stakeholder input - it is not available yet.

#### Q & A after the Presentation:

How will the SB Vision Plan relate and be integrated into the Master Plan and Vice Versa? Answer is basically there will be input from same stakeholders.

Multiple lack of enforcement and jurisdiction questions.

LA28: Will the LA 2028 Olympics have any impact on the Master Plan or Vice Versa. Brief answer was that all the LA 28 venues proposed are temporary. Though some food establishments may end up permanently there.

Poaching - this has been a problem, CA Fish and Wildlife will be part of the process for the Master Plan.

- **6.a.** Signage/Wayfinding in Sepulveda Basin: Kathy Shreiner briefly described work on this people can't find anything in the basin. She will meet with Richard Davis from SFV Audubon on signage issues and report back.
- **6b. Post Fire What to Do:** Discussion, possible hydroseeding. Muriel noted there may be a tight time frame, possible funding from Consortium, Audubon, etc. Pat noted that controlled burns were studied, USACE prevented but possible in future. Concluded to study further. Pat, George, Dan, Muriel and Nurit will be on a sub committee to study this.

**6d. CF 24-0909:** Pat noted this would be heard by City council tomorrow, would pass, questioned why the reference to a working group was removed by amendment. Rosie Avetisyan from CD 6 clarified that the multi-agency working group is actually meeting regarding remediation of the basin situations. Dan and Nurit requested that the SBWASC be a part of the working group for example to assist with getting volunteers to help with id'ing native plants vs weeds.
